Bring a sack lunch for Saturday, tent, Class A uniform, clothes, sleeping bag, Health History form, Scout book, and other personals.

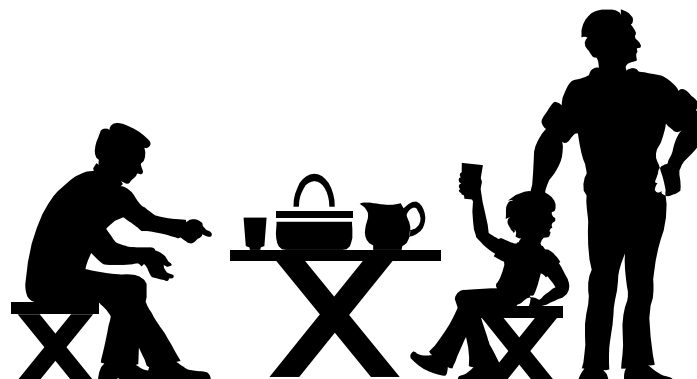
