2007 Pack 736 Pinewood Derby Rules (Cub Scouts) (Junior Outlaws)

Eligibility of Contestants and Cars

- The 2007 Scout Competition is open to all Pack 736 Cub Scouts
- **Cars in the 2007 Scout Competition must have been built new for the race season. Cars or parts of a car (such as wheels or axles) from a previous year are prohibited.**
- The 2007 Junior Outlaw Competition is open to all family members of Pack 736 Cub Scouts of Cub Scout age and younger.
- **Cars in the 2007 Junior Outlaw Competition must have been built new for the race season. Cars or parts of a car (such as wheels and axles) from a previous year are prohibited.**
- **Any car entered in race must have been purchased from Pack 736 this year or it will not be allowed to race.**
- **The Competition for the Pack overall this year will be only for the Scouts.**
- Each entrant may only register one car.
- Each car must pass a technical inspection, cars will be impounded until all races are completed and results are finalized.
- Ungentlemanly or un-sportsmanlike conduct by any participant or spectator will be grounds for expulsion from the competition and/or the race area.

Length, Width and Clearance

- Cars must be built using the materials in the Official Pinewood Derby Kit. This includes the pinewood block, axles, and wheels. With the exception of decorative and construction items (weights, glue, lubricants, finishing materials), only materials from the official kit may be used. Separately purchased items (contoured pinewood bodies, machined wheels, polished axles) are specifically prohibited.
- Maximum overall width (including wheels and axles) must not exceed 2-3/4".
- Minimum width between wheels shall be 1-3/4" so the car will clear the center guide strip.
- Minimum clearance between the bottom of the car and the bottom of the wheels shall be 3/8" so the car will clear the center guide strip. It is recommended that the weights on the bottom of the car be inset so they are flush with the bottom of the wood block.
- Maximum length of the car shall not exceed 7".
- Maximum height of the car shall not exceed 4".
- The wheelbase (distance between front and rear axles) may not be changed from the body kit distance of 4-1/4".
- Cars may not protrude beyond the starting post.

Wheels & Axles

- Only the wheels and axles from the official Grand Prix Pinewood Derby Kit may be used.
- Wheels and axles that have been modified by other parties are prohibited.
- Beveling, tapering, thin sanding, wafering, drilling or lathe turning of the wheels is prohibited.
- Solid axles are prohibited.
- Wheel bearings, washers, bushing, and hubcaps are prohibited.
- Car shall not ride on any type of springs.
- Car must be freewheeling with no starting device or other propulsion.

Weight and Appearance

- Weight of car shall not exceed 5 ounces (141.7 grams). The reading of the Official Race Scale will be considered final.
- No loose materials of any kind are permitted in or on the car.

Lubrication

- Only dry powder lubricants such as graphite or powdered Teflon "white lube" will be allowed.
- All lubricants must be applied prior to technical inspection.

2007 Pack 736 Pinewood Derby Rules (Outlaws)

Eligibility of Contestants Cars

- The 2007 Outlaw Competition is open to all Pack 736 Cub Scouts, Scout leaders, and their families. Children Cub Scout age and younger may race separately from older children and adults.
- **Cars in the 2007 Outlaw competition must have been built new for the race season. Cars or parts of a car (such as wheels and axles) from a previous year are prohibited.**
- **Any car entered in race must have been purchased from Pack 736 this year or it will not be allowed to race.**
- Each entrant may only register one car.
- Each car must pass a technical inspection before it may compete.
- Decisions by race officials on race day are final and not subject to appeal.
- After passing technical inspection, cars will be impounded until all races are completed and results are finalized.
- Ungentlemanly or unsportsmanlike conduct by any participant or spectator will be grounds for expulsion from the competition and/or the race area.

Length, Width and Clearance

- Maximum overall width (including wheels and axles) must not exceed 2-3/4".
- Minimum width between wheels shall be 1-3/4" so the car will clear center guide strip.
- Minimum clearance between the bottom of the car and the bottom of the wheels shall be 3/8" so the car will clear the center guide strip. It is recommended that the weights on the bottom of the car be inset so they are flush with the bottom of the wood block.
- Maximum length of the car shall not exceed 7".
- Maximum height of the car shall not exceed 4".
- The wheelbase (distance between front and rear axles) may not be changed from the body distance of 4-1/4".
- Cars may not protrude beyond the starting post.

Wheels and Axles

- Only the wheels and axles from the official Grand Prix Pinewood Derby Kit may be used.
- Wheels and axles that have been modified by other parties are prohibited.
- Solid axles are prohibited.
- Wheel bearings, washers, bushings, and hubcaps are prohibited.
- Car shall not ride on any type of springs.
- Car must be freewheeling with no starting device or other propulsion.

Weight and Appearance

- Weight of the car shall not exceed 10 ounces. The reading of the Official Race Scale will be considered final.
- No loose material of any kind is permitted in or on the car.

Lubrication

- Only dry powder lubricants such as graphite or powdered Teflon "white lube" will be allowed.
- All lubricants must be applied prior to technical inspection.

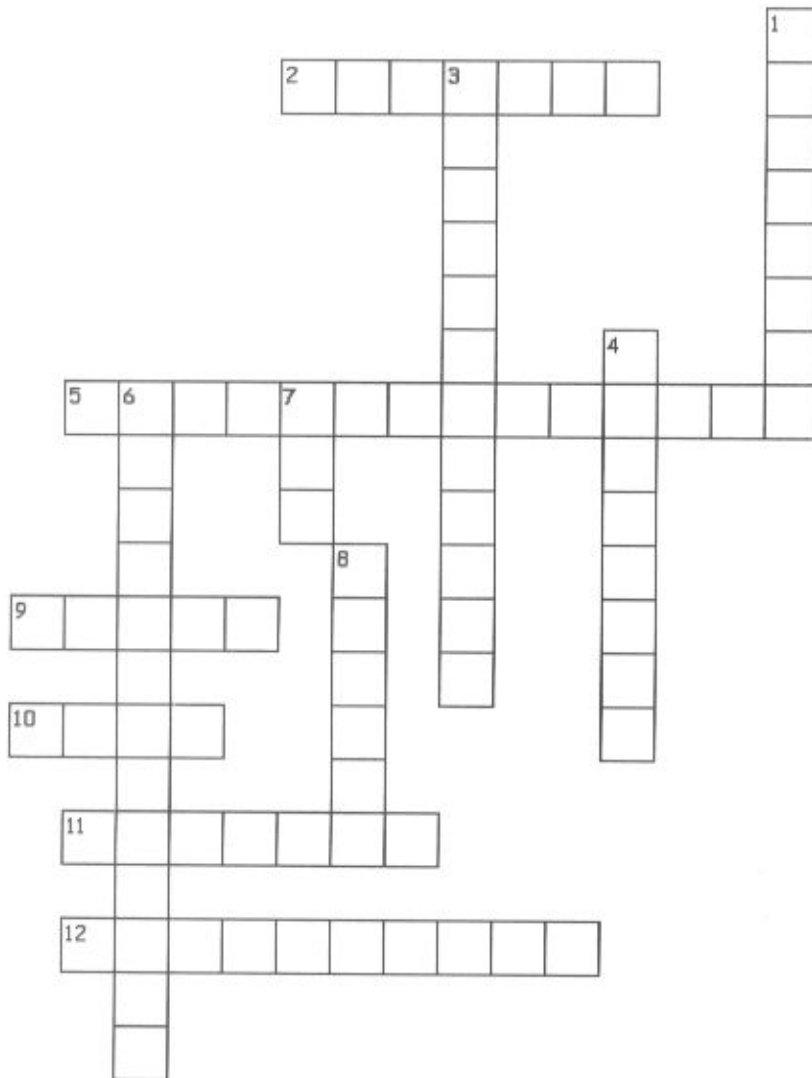
